22 facts (had on good authority)

- 1 – Leen Voet painted the works of this exhibition on canvas in oil manufactured by Couleurs Leroux and Blockx.
- 2 – All works in this exhibition have been created one by one between June 2015 and April 2016.
- 3 – Some paintings have been altered after drying.
- 4 – The 22 paintings are based on drawings or paintings of amateur artists and show each time one or multiple pets.
- 5 – Only the painting of the pigeon shows a stuffed animal.
- 6 – The works of the amateur artists were put up for sale online on Kapaza and Hebbes.
- 7 – In the meantime most of the ads are no longer online.
- 8 – Leen Voet has decided not to show the images of the amateur artists.
- 9 – The oldest work would date from 1938.
- 10 – The titles of the 22 paintings correspond with the descriptions in the online ads.
- 11 – The spelling mistakes and punctuation have been taken over from these ads.
- 12 – The title of the exhibition is also the title of the painting with the mare and stallion against a yellow background.
- 13 – This title is also used for the full series of paintings.
- 14 – The measures of the paintings sometimes correspond with those of the copied works.
- 15 – The smallest painting of the show, *H. Schmidt Akt Katze*, measures 48 x 34 cm.
- 16 – The biggest painting of the show, *Paard hengst*, measures 89 x 65,5 cm.
- 17 – The sizes of the paintings determine the price according the proportion : 1 cm² = 1 €.
- 18 – All paintings are signed in pencil by Leen Voet and dated on the backside.
- 19 – On the occasion of the exhibition, trampoline books edits an artist book in which the 22 preparatory drawings of Leen Voet are reproduced.
- 20 – The line drawings have been drawn with a digital pad in Illustrator.
- 21 – On Saturday May 21 Leen Voet will colour 22 copies of her artist book on the occasion of the Antwerp Art Weekend (a different drawing in each copy).
- 22 – Leen Voet has two cats called Fenton and Telmo.
